Over many years I've been nibbling at the background of my mother's Cornish ancestors. I've had considerable help from various Vicars of St Keverne Parish Church, Mr Frank Currow, Stephen Hobbes, <sup>Mr H.L. Dore</sup> more recently Mrs Betty Farrell.

My mother's maiden name was Cock. Her father's family farmed Lesneague for 3 generations, the first mention in the Tithe books was <sup>1768</sup> (Nichols)

A widow <sup>of Robert Cock</sup> Redegund, moved from Constantine with her teen age son Peter. 12.3.1753

Robert Cock <sup>1716</sup> a yeoman was buried in Constantine April 1753. - Pinner of administering his estate was granted to his wife August 1753. Inventory of his goods included leasehold tenements at Trecombe, Treleggan & Trevease. All in Constantine. Would there be any clue to his early death?

Redagon Nichols or Robert Cock of Constantine at St Anthony in Meneage Dec 31st 1741.

Robert baptised 1747.

Has anyone researched the origins of the Cock family in general. On the family seem to have left St Keverne after the 1848 harvest but appear in the 1851 census on a farm called Newhey near Altarnun.

Any hints of why they moved? Was there a family connection perhaps of Catherine Phillips? Could it have been conversion to Methodism?

Katherine Phillips last 3 children were baptised at Crauan. An old letter makes reference to Ledstoun.
