Thank you for your letter of July 31st.

1. I have searched our Marriage Register for the years 1816-1837 and there is no reference of any COCK marriage during that period.

2. I have searched our Baptism Records for the years 1824-1834 and the following are recorded:-

Edwin	"	Dec 8 th 1831
Catherine	"	Dec 3 rd 1835
Harriett	"	Oct-3 rd 1828
Mary	"	Feb. 6 th 1838
Edwin	"	Sept. 25. 1833.

Also:-

May 1. 1836 Henry s. of John Henry & Mary Ann Cook

May 9 1841 John s of John & Marianna Cook of Foyance.

July 7 1844 Elizabeth - - -

3. I see there was one marriage between 1816-1837

and that was - John Henry Cook and Mary Ann Tripney
on Dec. 13th. 1835.

4. I am afraid that I do not know what the
term "Marriage Allegations" means.
5. Catherine Phillips was probably not a St. Kewens
Girl and she may most likely have been married
at the church in her home village - wherever that was.
6. You might be able to get further help from -
The Registrar, Registry Office, Cross Street, Helston,
Cornwall.
7. The charge for Search of Register is 10p per
each year, so the charge for the search I have
made is £4:30.

I think that has answered all the
questions raised in your letter although it has
not given you all the information you desired.

Edwin Cook: baptised 8. 12. 1831
died 29. 12. 1831.

Marriage of Peter Cook to Mary Munday:
no trace in my records from 1822-1860. Only
Cook reference - John Henry Cook to Mary
Ann Munday on Dec. 13th 1835

Baptisms. Children of Robert and
Catherine Cook - Robert Peter May 13. 1830. -
Edwin Sept. 25. 1833 - Catherine Dec. 3 1835 -
Mary Feb. 6. 1838 - Then children of
John Henry and Mary Ann Cook - Henry
May 1. 1836 - John May 9. 1841 - Elizabeth
July 7. 1844. Registers searched from
1822-1846. I have mined out one
of Robert & Catherine's children - Harriett
Oct 3. 1828

Schooling. Tanner's sons would
have gone to local schools at Porthallon,
Porthorstock, Trabboe, St. Kewena - Corvack.

There will be no records with the
Bishop at Inuro and, in any case, the
diocese of Inuro was not formed until
1877. Prior to that Cornwall had been in
the Exeter diocese.

If you can give me any further
information about Robert Cook (died 1880)
then I would try and find something.

LESMEAQUE = TUDOR'S COURT

This is a farm of about 150 acres in St Herve Parish. It is part of Lanneth estate once owned by the Williams family (local Squire) and rented out to tenant farmers until acquired by the present owner, who inherited the estate some 7 years ago. The farm-house still stands and is let privately, as are all the farmhouses on the estate as the owner "Paul Dylor" is farming the whole estate as one concern.

Looking back in the old Rate Books I find four tenants at LESMEAQUE in 1721, they were

P.T.O.

George HARRIS, Thomas WHITE, Humphry HILL & Thomas
ROSKILLY, they paid a Church Rate respectively of 4/-,
3/1½, 4/-, 4½. In 1747 we find Mathew NICHOLS 2/-,
John HILL 2/-, Sam WHITE 1/9¾, Thomas ROSKILLY 3/2½.

I would like to know if any of these had
connections with your family, or possibly others of a
later date. Perhaps you could say why you are
interested in LESWENEGUE, with a view to helping
you further.
