Their only son Keith became a father for the 5th time at Christmas. Keith is quite well off because of early investments in property, so 5 wee mouths to feed doesn't seem to worry him.

I loved the letter you sent, written in 1957 by Mr. Lambrick. I have duly stored it with other information
