Leedstown

Benneton Manor - John Wesley slept many times & conducted services there. For many years services held regularly.

Original chapel at Grannear Downs thatched roof 2 windmills on each side. Lime-ash floor kept sandier. Old fashioned pulpit with a leaders' seat enclosed one for the men & one for women - free will.

1862, became too small - fair sized village new main road from Halston to Hayle.

Opened 1863 Rev Rattenbury
Cost £1000 ^{in 3 parts} voluntarily laboured by farmers & carrying stone.

Foundⁿ of the school room at the rear laid in 1909

Bentley house in almost every farm in the woods

Plants here introduced by Sir John St Bevilys in 1723

Plants here some real seeds of noble and gentlemanly
Pines, spruce, Scotch & silver firs, larch, fir, ash, birch, sycamore, beech, oak, ash, Spanish chestnut, lime, alder, poplar.

Pines from Scotland first introduced to the house
