In answer to your letter dated 5th August 1981.
I am sorry I don't think I can be of any
assistance to you.

My father purchased "FLEURS" during the last
war from a Mr. Pat. McGuire - his brother was Premier
of N.S.W. at one time. However I do not have any
knowledge of previous owners.

The address of "Fleurs" is R.M.B 313 Mamre Rd
at Mamre. Mamre Rd was called Liverpool Rd
until sometime in the 1960's.

The property was bought by a company connected -
as far as I know - in some way with Crooks Holdings Ltd.

I believe it is still run as a farm.

There are quite a few places known to be connected
with the Cox family - "Fernhill" at Mulgoa -
"Hobartville" at Richmond to name two, but I
have not come across the name Coak.

I am sorry I cannot be more help to you -
wish you luck in your search.

Dear Mrs Hohen.

Your letter has been received requesting information about 'Fleuro' on Moamre Road. It was an original grant of 3,550 acres to Nicholas Bayly and he came to own 2,000 acres eventually around Kemp's Creek and Moamre Road. The House was built before 1811 as Mitchell Library manuscripts note that Nicholas and his wife were staying at the farm in that year. By 1814 a substantial farm must have been under way as a preacher William Brock stayed there and said "it was a noble mansion with gardens and cultivated grounds". After his death in Sep. 1823 the house and farm were placed on the market.

Richard Jones was a subsequent owner of 'Fleuro' after 1825 when he returned to the colony. He was forced to sell this estate when the depression of the 1840's forced him to sell all his ships and estates.

I have no further information about later owners of this estate and would advise you to write to the Lands Department. Please Alfred Rd. Sydney or go in there yourself if you are able to go. Wishing you all the best
