Thank you very much for your letter of 14<sup>th</sup> August with the detailed itinerary of Alfred Whitten's round the world travels in 1912. It certainly was a grand tour.

I did not mean you to go to so much trouble, but the information is very much appreciated.

Log of logs, and its planned Supplement, includes references to voyage narratives right up to the present day; although apart from the first fleet re-enactment & recent yacht voyages, there are not many modern accounts. In due course they will be of interest to maritime enthusiasts & researchers.

- So if you have any post war diaries of sea voyages & don't mind their whereabouts being catalogued for posterity or some future researcher to consult, I would be grateful for brief details. Just ship, dates & terminal ports will suffice. Some people prefer that a copy be made & lodged in a major library or museum (e.g. the National Library) for reference, rather than listing a private address. - However, if you would prefer not to have anything further listed don't worry, & forget it, so they say!

AUSTRALIAN HISTORIC RECORDS REGISTER -  
NARRATIVES OF VOYAGES.

For some years now I have been cataloguing the whereabouts of ships' logs and journals, crew & passenger diaries, and letters, etc, describing voyages to, from, or in the Australian and NZ area and the surrounding seas since 1788 (including published versions of voyage narratives). Before the first volume of "Log of Logs" was published last year I was able to include many of the shipboard diaries and journals listed in the then recently released Historic Records Register arising from the Bicentennial records search project.

The response to Log of Logs has been very heartening & many individuals and institutions have sent in details of further narratives. I have also had time to go through the above Register in much more detail and have found many more logs, voyage diaries and letters, etc, but in some cases the ship's name or dates of voyage are missing or obscure. With these details to add to other recent input, a Supplement to the Log of Logs would be worthwhile.

It would therefore be greatly appreciated if the ship's name, date and author of the narrative in the following H.R.R. item could be advised please (only vessel's name and date(s) required where some type of voyage account exists).

HRR 923 + Diary by Alfred G. WHITTEN of a voyage to Europe + U.S.A., 1913-14, and return?  
(names of ships for the legs of trip from & to Australia would suffice, thanks)  
I would also be grateful for details of any other voyage narratives held.
