I am going away myself in early November for two months, to South Africa, so I am trying to clear up everything well in advance because there will be Christmas shopping to be done for all the family at this end as well as countless other home tasks. I always wonder when it comes to that sort of thing, whether it is worth going away at all!

Now to the business of accounting. Your first letter enclosed a £20 note and my first report taking 3 hours was £9. My next report, sent on 4th August took 5 hours in all, a further £15. This was followed by the copies of the Wills; map; and pages from the book on Constanting as follows:
