I've been staying in this house while the owner, Howard Curnow, was in USA touring & speaking at the Cornish Settlement area here. He returned last week & is happy for

me to stay on, on an expenses-sharing basis  
so I have a roof over my head now & in an  
absolutely beautiful part of Cornwall. So  
now I just have to wait for some work to  
appear.

changed colour & are falling everywhere.
