(Agricultural labourers)  
m. Jane Armitage ~~left~~  
Left Ireland with 4 children, sailing on the 'Woodlodge' from Cork arriving 10.3.1842. They were "bounty immigrants" contracted to work in Bathurst. The youngest child died shortly after arrival and Charlotte was born 17<sup>th</sup> July 1842. (my grandmother) Not long afterwards they moved to Emu Creek in the Hunter Valley.

Baptised 17<sup>th</sup> Nov 1844 in Parish of Whittingham in County Northumberland NSW.

Richard was killed as a result of a fall from a horse in 1863<sup>o</sup> was buried near the church at FALBROOK.
