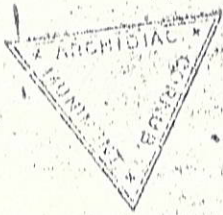

the subscribed Witnesses to the last Will and Testament of John
Coombe late of the same Parish
German deceased, now hereunto annexed,

beginning thus,—"This is the last Will and Testament
of me John Coombe of Perran in the Parish
of Altonna in the County of Cornwall"

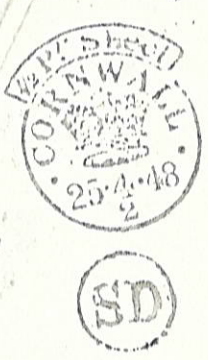
ending thus,—"In Witness whereof I the said John
Coombe the Testator have to this my last Will and
Testaments set and subscribed my hand and Seal
the twenty first day of March one thousand
eight hundred and forty five"
and thus subscribed,—"John Coombe" and

And that this Deponent and John Sanderoock
the other subscribed Witness to
the same Will, were present at the same time when the said deceased,
on the twenty first day of March 1845 wrote
and subscribed his name to the said Will, and this Deponent and the said
John Sanderoock and

subscribed their names thereto, in the presence of the
said Testator, and of each other, as Witnesses thereof. And this
deponent further swears that having now
carefully viewed and inspected the said Will
and observed the words "all the above Legacies
to be paid within twelve months after my decease"
interlined between the second and third lines
of the second side of the said Will with that such
interlineation was made and inserted previous
to the execution of the said Will by the said
deceased -

This is the last Will and Testament of me
John Coombe of Berras in the Parish of
Altarnun in the County of Cornwall. —

First I give and bequeath to my
daughter-in-law Ann Coombe the sum
of Five Pounds. —

Also I give and bequeath to Eliza
Ann the daughter of my deceased Son
William Coombe the sum of Thirty Pounds. —

Also I give and bequeath to my
grandson John Jenkin the sum of Forty
Pounds. — I have a Note of hand from my
said grandson John Jenkin for Thirty Pounds
and when the above legacy becomes due
this said Note of hand for Thirty Pounds
is to be in part of payment for the said
legacy of Forty Pounds. —

Also I give and bequeath to my
grandson Samuel Jenkin the sum of
Forty Pounds. —

Also I give and bequeath to my
Brother Christopher Coombe the sum of
Five Pounds. —

If either of my said grandsons
John and Samuel Jenkin shall die
without leaving lawful issue before


his legacy shall become due then I give the
legacy of him so dying to the survivor of
them. All the above legacies to be paid within twelve months after my
decease. All the Rest Residue and Remainder of
my goods Chattels and effects not herein before
given both real and Personal and of whatsoever
name or nature or wheresoever or whatever
else I may die possessed of I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Charity the Wife of Richard Stephens
and also Nominate and appoint my said
3 daughter the Wife of Richard Stephens whole
and Sole Executrix of this my last Will
and Testament —

In Witness whereof I the said John Coombe
the testator have to this my last Will and
Testament set and subscribed my hand and
seal the twenty-first day of March One
Thousand eight hundred and Forty-five —

Signed, sealed, published and declared
by the said testator, John Coombe
as and for his last Will and
Testament, in the presence of us,
who, at his request, in the presence
of each other, have hereunto
subscribed our names as Witnesses
thereto. —
